JANUARY DEADLINES

State of Maryland Institutional Part-Time Grant

Category: Undergraduate

Who may apply: Part-time, degree-seeking undergraduates and students dually enrolled in a Maryland high school and an institution of higher education.

How to apply: Part-time undergraduates must complete and file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.gov. Contact the financial aid office of the institution you will attend and ask to be considered for the Part-Time Grant.

Dually enrolled students must contact the financial aid office of the institution you will attend to determine eligibility to apply.

When to apply: It is suggested that you file your FAFSA as soon after October 1 as is possible. Contact the financial aid office of the institution you will attend for additional deadlines.

Eligible majors: All majors are eligible.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS: You and your parents (if you are a dependent student) must be Maryland residents. You must enroll at a two-year or four-year Maryland college or university as a part-time (6-11 credits per semester), degree-seeking undergraduate student. You must demonstrate financial need. Recipients are selected by the institution.

FINANCIAL NEED: Eligibility for a Part-Time Grant is based on student financial need, as determined by the FAFSA.

AWARD AMOUNT: The minimum Part-Time Grant award is \$200, and the maximum award is \$2,000. Funds may not be available to award all eligible students.

RENEWING AN AWARD: To renew your award, you must maintain satisfactory academic progress at the college you attend and file the FAFSA each year. It is suggested that you file the FAFSA by March 1 each year, or earlier if required by your school. You must also continue to demonstrate financial need. You may be a recipient of a Part-Time Grant for a total of eight years. Your school determines renewal policies.

Honoring the legacy and character of our nation's 40th President, the GE-Reagan Foundation Scholarship Program rewards college-bound students who demonstrate exemplary leadership, drive, integrity, and citizenship with financial assistance to pursue higher education.

Each year, the Program selects numerous recipients to receive a \$10,000 scholarship renewable for up to an additional three years – up to \$40,000 total per recipient. Awards are for undergraduate study and may be used for education-related expenses, including tuition, fees, books, supplies, room, and board. In addition, Scholars are invited to participate in a special awards program and receive ongoing leadership-development support.

Eligibility: The contest is open to United States high school students in grades nine through twelve attending public, private, parochial, or home schools; U.S. students under the age of twenty enrolled in a high school correspondence/GED program in any of the fifty states, the District of Columbia, or the U.S. territories; and U.S. citizens attending schools overseas. Past winners and finalists are not eligible to participate. Employees of John Hancock Financial Services and members of their families are not eligible to participate.

Topic: Describe and analyze an act of political courage by a US elected official who served during or after 1917, the year John F. Kennedy was born. Include an analysis of the obstacles, risks, and consequences associated with the act. The essay may concern an issue at the local, state, national, or international level.

Requirements: Essays must be the original work of the student. Essays must be at least 700 words and not more than 1,000 words. They must include five varied sources. See Eligibility and Requirements section for more information. Essays about past recipients of the Profile in Courage Award recipients will be disqualified unless they describe an act of political courage other than the act for which the award was given.

Award: The winner receives \$10,000. The winner and his/her family are invited to the Profile in Courage Award ceremony to accept his/her award. The ceremony is held in May at the John F. Kennedy Presidential Library in Boston. A second place winner receives a \$3,000 cash award. Five finalists each receive a \$1,000 cash award. Eight semifinalists receive \$100 each. Ten students receive honorable mention. All winners receive a hardcover copy of Profiles in Courage by John F. Kennedy.

Educational Assistance Grant awards may be used at an institution out of state only if the award recipient is a deaf or hearing impaired student and their institution makes special provisions for deaf and hearing impaired students that are not available at Maryland institutions. This award is based on financial need. Your need is based on the cost of the institution you attend and your housing status. As a condition of receiving a Maryland State scholarship or grant, you pledge to remain drug free for the full term of the award. Unlawful use of drugs and alcohol may endanger your enrollment in a Maryland college, as well as your Maryland financial aid award. Current high school seniors with a minimum 2.5 GPA who are enrolled at a Maryland college or university as a full-time student and demonstrate financial need.
